## PASTOR'S STUDY

The day began beautifully. While I went to church, Beth took Caleb to his hockey game (please do not get me started on Sunday morning hockey games) and while his team lost, he had the chance to play goalie, which he loves to do. After his hockey game, Beth stopped at a resale shop and Caleb was fortunate enough to find two used games for his GameCube video game - so he got a couple of pre-presents. Then he opened his regular presents. Caleb was thrilled with everything that he received, but he told Lydia, who gave him a homemade gift, that hers was his favorite present (it was a true Hallmark moment). The rest of his afternoon was spent playing with a buddy.

That evening, we had family friends over to watch the Super Bowl. For Caleb, this meant more kids to play with and more fun to be had. In fact, Caleb hardly watched the game because he was having so much fun. As the game was winding down, Caleb stopped by to see what was going on with the game. He saw that the Patriots and his favorite player, Tom Brady, were losing. He was too nervous to watch the end, so he left the room. Moments later, after the game ended with the New York Giants barely defeating the New England Patriots, Caleb walked in and asked, "Did they lose?" "Yes," I said. Sullenly Caleb walked down the hall.

After our friends left, I found Caleb in his bedroom. He was lying on his bed, absolutely dejected. "How are you doing?" I asked. "Terrible," he replied. "This is the worst birthday ever. Those stupid Giants - they ruined my birthday." "Caleb," I said. "Think of what you did today. You played

goalie, you got all sorts of presents, you played with friends all day, you had cake, ice cream, hamburgers - you had an awesome birthday!" "No it wasn't," he replied. "It stunk."

For a time, I continued trying to convince Caleb that he had a great birthday, but I finally gave up. I found it amazing and rather frustrating that one thing could so completely impact his perspective, especially after I had so convincingly shown him how he should be thinking. But then I realized that he was doing something that we all fall victim to doing.

Each of us, from time to time, can become so clouded in our perspective that reason is completely ignored. Our ideas, our opinions, our fears and our prejudices become so much a part of us that we refuse to consider a different perspective. We do that with politics, we do that with religion, we do that with so much of life. Yet, we Christians follow a man who was open to all and reached out to others with warmth and grace, meeting them where they were and serving them as they needed. The clouds that cover our view of the world can be pushed aside. May we have the strength and faithfulness to do just that.



### There are three ways to participate:

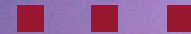
- † attend Pastor led sessions at Bethel

Lent is a time of promise and renewal accomplished over days and through moments; shaped by service, study, prayer and worship.

These Bible Study opportunities are designed to guide and aid in your Lenten journey towards spiritual renewal.

*He grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised.*

Romans 4:20b-21



## SESSIONS

During Lent 2012 we will focus our attention on *Promise* and *Renewal*; the PROMISES and covenants God has made to God's people and the RENEWAL that we experience as we live into those promises. The Lesson each week in worship will draw our attention to the covenants and promises God has made. Specifically, the five covenants that will be the focus of the Sunday morning preaching are:

- † God's covenant with Noah and for all generations that God will use creation itself, a rainbow, to remember God's own promise to be our God and will "never again curse the ground... nor destroy every living creature."
- † God's covenant with Abraham and Sarah to be the father of many nations.
- † God's covenant of the Law and the Ten Commandments given to Moses and the people.
- † God healing the Israelites through Moses lifting up the serpent in the wilderness.
- † God's promised new covenant announced by Jeremiah.

To complement these Sunday lessons, Paul's Letter to the Romans will serve as our text of Biblical reading and study. Each week the Bible Study will,

in some way, reference the corresponding Old Testament lesson and covenant. Some weeks that connection between texts will be clear and strong while other weeks there will be only an opaque linking. But, through it all I am confident that we all will be renewed in our faith in this Lenten journey of 2012.
