IN MEMORIAM



MARY C. CONLIN

The Bethel community lost a truly special person when Mary Conlin died on January 6, 2012. Mary had been on staff at Bethel for over 20 years and in that time she connected with countless people through her work with Bethel's XYZ ministry and in coordinating Bethel's many volunteers. Mary shared her gifts with more than just these folks over the years. She also taught 2 year old Sunday School and many confirmation classes, she worked with the Prime Timers group, the Bethel Senior Citizens, Bethel Friends and cooked for Bethel's outreach home on Johnson Street. During her years at Bethel, Mary was a part of many ministries, many programs and many events. In each task, she brought compassion, enthusiasm and faithfulness.



As a colleague of Mary's for nearly 18 years, I came to see her as more than just a co-worker - Mary was a dear friend. She had a kindness that was genuine and beautiful, she had a presence that was warm and unassuming and she had a faith that was deep and true. What I found most striking about Mary, however, was simply her goodness. As I said in the sermon I gave at her funeral, "Mary saw beauty and goodness and worth in many places - in places that many of us, certainly me - might overlook, take for granted or simply ignore. And she had the kind of heart that was especially concerned for the cast off, the lonely and those forgotten by society."

Mary's death has brought sadness to many. As we mourn her death and as we pray for her family in their time of grief, I hope we also remember to thank God for Mary and for the many gifts that she brought to our community. We will miss you, Mary.

Loved the big hugs when we arrived at the church. Everyone said "welcome home." On Friday night, they took us to a fabulous place, about an hour away, where we parked our cars and took an army truck up the side of a mountain. At the top was a restaurant where we had wonderful local food. The cross was lit up and when we went back down we could see it for miles.



We had lots of rain but we all worked right through it. Pr. Scot and I power washed for two days, so the rain felt good.
