Since 2000, Bethel has hosted a delegation of children from Borodyanka, Ukraine, near the site of the Chernobyl nuclear explosion for six weeks during the summer. During their stay with Bethel families, they receive medical exams and dental work, attend English classes, and have fun.

The Circle of Love project is primarily funded by Bethel's annual golf outing. Monies raised are used to sponsor the children from Ukraine and to improve the dental care in the Borodyanka community. The minimum contribution for lunch, 18 holes of golf, a cart and dinner is \$125.

## FROM THE PASTOR

## Church Building



He began the sermon with a question: "Why do we build, or for that matter, rebuild churches today?" It was not a question I expected to hear as Ruth and I attended a Sunday morning Matins service at the historic St. Paul's Cathedral in London. The preacher was Pastor Mark Oakley, the treasurer of St. Paul's.

Pr. Oakley remarked that he had preached at the Frauenkirche (Motherchurch) in Dresden the previous Sunday. He commented that it was 45 years ago that American and British bombers had bombed the city resulting in a firestorm which killed thousands of people as well as leveling the city. Six years ago the people of Great Britain had given a gift of a gold cross to complete the spire of the Frauenkirche. People cheered on streets below as the cross was set on the top of the church signaling the completion of the reconstruction. In light of this new relationship, Pr. Oakley was pleased to have been invited to preach to the people of Dresden.

On his way back to the airport, the cab driver asked Pr. Oakley if he had enjoyed his time in Dresden. Pr. Oakley replied that he had been asked to preach at the Frauenkirche and that it was an honor to do so. He also said that he had another connection to the city. He said he had been raised by his grandfather who had actually navigated a bomber over Dresden on the night of the firebombing. After some silence, the cab driver sadly responded, "My mother was killed by the bombing that night." More silence, then the cab driver pulled the cab to the side of the road, turned off the ignition, and stretched out his hand to the back seat of the cab. They shared an extended handshake. It was not an occasion for more words. They drove in silence back to the airport. When they arrived, the cab

driver would not take any money from Pr. Oakley.

Pr. Oakley said he was again reminded why continuing to build churches was important. The church continues to be a school for relating. God is our most important reality. That is a message which continues to reach over the boundaries of countries through times of war and peace. That is a message not constrained by time. Next August I'll be leading another trip to East Central Europe. Even though we won't go to Dresden on this trip, we will hear similar stories throughout our trip. We will be traveling to places which were touched by the Holocaust and have experienced decades of repressive governments. And we will share many stories from our friends who are anxious to host us. On our last trip, we held an Art Fair in the newly built framework of a new church...yes, churches are being built for the same reasons they have always been built...to share the love of God in Christ Jesus. It may be an old, old story, but it is still our story today.
