### Dad, don't freak

Those were the first words that my daughter, Lydia, said to me when she called my cell phone from home. I was in my office when I received her call, and despite the request that I not "freak," I did. After making sure she and her brother, Caleb, were ok, I asked what happened.

"Well, you know that flat-screen TV in the basement? Caleb was playing on his Xbox and wanted to adjust the TV, and so he grabbed it to try to move it. When he did that, the little nail in the back of the TV – you know, the one that was supposed to be holding it to the entertainment center – it popped and the TV crashed down to the floor, right on his feet. And actually, there is still sounds coming from the TV and some really crazy lines too. There is a crack in the screen, but maybe we could get it fixed?"

At that point in the conversation I really found it hard to talk. I wanted to scream, or cry or worse. And, I was really tempted to look round my office to see if there was a hidden camera, but what I finally did was ask to speak to Caleb. Reluctantly, he got on the phone. The conversation went as one might expect - Caleb explaining how he accidentally broke the TV and me not comprehending how such a thing could happen. I tried not to lecture Caleb, but I couldn't help myself. The lecture was not well received, and our phone conversation ended poorly. Upon my arrival home a few hours later, I continued my lecture and ultimately said some things that were not helpful or kind.

### Dad, don't freak, continued

The following days were a bit rough at our home. I found myself avoiding the basement because I just could not bring myself to look at the broken TV and worse, I found that there was unpleasant edginess between Caleb and me. Over time, however, something happened. That "something" was not a miraculous event or a benevolent action; instead it was simply spoken words – words expressing regret, words offering forgiveness and words conveying love.

Despite the initial rough road, my family weathered this little storm. Which is what families do, and it is what friends, colleagues, partners and neighbors do. This compassionate and honest conversation is what people do when they find themselves in conflict with another person and desire to resolve the issue with integrity and concern.

At least it is what we should do. I think about the video of NFL football player Ray Rice knocking out his then-fiancee in a casino elevator. Sin has a nasty way of influencing the way we behave. I do not get what happened on that elevator, nor do I get why the Baltimore Ravens and the NFL handled the resulting investigation the way they did. But I do get that this whole sad situation happened. It happened because humans are not always so eager to resolve their issues with integrity and concern. Ray Rice isn't, and neither are we.

Personal integrity and concern for others – we often times point our fingers at others who misbehave in some way and suggest they lack these two things and perhaps they do. But they are not alone. Each of us can do better. As followers of Christ, we are called to live lives that reveal God's love, grace and kindness – that is our task each day. I was not revealing much of that love, grace and kindness the day Lydia called and asked that I not "freak." Today, I hope to do better.
