I have never been a “fatalist.” A fatalist is someone who feels that no matter what he or she does, the outcome will be the same because it's predetermined. Fatalists share a sense of being powerless to change the world. I'm sure

part of the reason I'm not a fatalist is because I was raised in a church that was powered by a belief in the power of change brought by grace. Time and time again, the Bible holds up before us the promise of a new future, a future we help mold. At Bethel, we are in the very beginning stages of growing a new future. What we are doing now will deeply influence what that future looks like. Ghandi's quote is true “The future depends on what we do in the present.” One

of our major opportunities for church growth is among young adults. This includes people who are in the 20's, 30's and 40's. Madison is a destination city for millennials. They are moving downtown from all over the country by the thousands. They are our immediate neighbors, the people God has placed around us, the people God sends us to serve, invite, and share the good news of Jesus Christ.

Bethel's future growth is in the faces of these young adults. Our future is already present. As we live into that future, we will be adding new staff. Specifically, we will be adding a new pastor who will focus on Outreach. This new Outreach

Bethel's constitution allows for an associate pastor to be called on the single recommendation of the Lead Pastor to the Church Council. That has been Bethel's practice. However, for this position we will do something new. We

will form a Call Committee to help search and discern the best possible candidate for our new Outreach Pastor. When that person is identified, he or she will be recommended to the church council. In turn, the council will then make a recommendation to the full congregation. Finally, the entire congregation will be invited to meet and to vote for the new pastor.

Joyfully, hopefully, and confidently, we begin the process now. We are calling for candidates to serve on

the Outreach Pastor Call Committee. The committee will be comprised of 6-9 people. On Sept 14, 128 boxes of kits and quilts were transported to the Madison rail yard for transportation to a regional warehouse in Minnesota.

Thanks to Bethel volunteers on "God's Work, Our Hands" Sunday almost 500 School Kits and 77 Personal Care Kits were assembled.



The Blanket Workshop meets all year round to create the quilts that are sent. The Blanket Workshop has made 9,237 Mission Quilts since first forming in 1969.

LWR donations provide kits and quilts to those in need and those touched by natural disaster or political upheaval. Racial Disparities in the Criminal Justice System



Caring for Social Justice is sponsoring workshops on “Racial Disparities in the Criminal Justice System” presented by Dr. Karen Reece from 10:15am-12:15pm on Oct 20 & Nov 3. Childcare is provided.

Oct 20 - Session II: The Prison System: Purpose and Programming

Karen will address the complex policies and practices that make

negotiating the prison system so difficult and confusing. What are the consequences of truth-in-sentencing laws, massive overcrowding and untreated mental health problems in a system designed for punishment, not treatment? The public perception of the criminal justice system is largely based on outdated assumptions and stereotypes as actual incarceration realities occur outside public view. Today’s session will help us understand the circumstances that can thwart offenders’ best efforts and what needed programs are or are not in place.

Nov 3 - Session III: Community Corrections: Life after Prison.

Karen will acquaint us with the disheartening challenges the formerly incarcerated face as they try to begin life anew. How has “community corrections” changed what was probation, parole and extended supervision? Dr. Karen Reece will describe some of the surprisingly legal stumbling blocks to reentry. Did you know, for instance, that a person living in the community can be returned to prison without due process or without being convicted of a new crime?

Some of the challenges to rejoining the community are the daily indignities and well ingrained social barriers to housing, employment, education and training. Of course, old friends and temptations can also deter them. With a better informed perspective, this session will provide new insights on “social justice” in the criminal justice system. 🌈




ROCKtoberfest Comes to Madison

a watching audience, you make the march out of the church. All the while you're a little embarrassed, maybe a little frustrated too. You might even think to yourself, "There's no point in coming to church. I get nothing out of it because I have to constantly care for my kid."

I want you - mothers and/or fathers - to know just how encouraging you are to so many. The elderly woman who often feels alone beams with a smile at the sight of you wrestling with your little one. She's been there before. She knows how hard it can be, but she smiles because to hear that brings back precious memories. Seeing young parents and their small children brighten her day; she may have just received bad news about her health but seeing the vitality of young ones removes - if but for a moment - her fears. The older man who always seems to be grouchy notices you too. He's always talking about how children in this day have no respect or sense of goodness. But he sees you - a young family - in church every week. Like clockwork, he can depend on the sight of you and your young family. You give him hope that maybe the Church isn't doomed after all, because there are still young parents who love God enough to bring their restless children to church.

Bring your children to church! If we don't hear crying, the church is dying. As hard as it might be for you as a parent who's half-asleep, keep on doing what you're doing. You are an encouragement, and you're starting off your children's lives as you should. 🌈

All Saints Day Celebration: For Saints both Living and Passed

On the weekend of Nov 2/3, Bethel offers a one-of-a-kind worship experience where we remember and celebrate the lives of people of faith, living and passed. A "saint" is not some spiritual super hero or holier-than-thou persona. A "saint" is simply a person who has been drawn into the mystery and reality of Jesus' resurrected life. All who are baptized into his living spirit are "Saints".

As we gather together on Nov 2/3 in the sanctuary, worship will be wrapped in wondrous light with streams of white. Special care has been taken to infuse the space with a heavenly air and mood.

Because All Saints Sunday brings with it the memory of loved ones passed, worship will begin with an honoring of those beloved souls. You are welcome, even encouraged, to gather in the sanctuary before worship begins to write the name of a loved one who has passed recently or long ago. A "Book of Life" will be laid-out at the front of the church for you to record your loved ones' names. You are also invited and encouraged to light a candle and place it in the box filled with sand in memory of someone, a saint living or past.

While people are recording names in the special Bethel "Book of Life" and lighting candles, Amy Hartsough will be play, on the organ, the deeply moving Samuel Barber piece "Adagio for Strings."

Once Amy has completed the piece, worship will begin with the Bethel "Book of Life" being brought up near the altar for presentation as the opening hymn begins. The names of Bethel members who have gone to join Jesus in the last year will be read aloud followed by a beautiful vocal duet by Amy Hartsough and Katie Gerlach of Andrew Lloyd Weber's "Pie Jesu."

Pastor Jerry Tews preaches that day a message on "Walking Each Other Home". Following the sermon, we sing the powerful and popular hymn "For All the Saints" with a naming of all those who have been baptized at Bethel in the last year. The Lord's Supper, of course, is celebrated, a reminder that we will all be reunited with all our loved ones at God's great heavenly banquet feast. The day's worship ends with a rousing version of "When the Saints Go Marching In".

Come early. Stay late. Bask in the pure white glow of a service that is like heaven on earth. 🌈
