

## **ONE STEP AT A TIME:**

Walking Through Hard Times

s we continue forward through this pandemic, I have been asked several times recently "how do you think Bethel is doing?" My answer is almost always the same. The pandemic is awful. It is a pain.

It is sad that so many people are getting sick. It is tragic that so many people are dying from the virus. It's almost unbearable that we are not able to offer in-person worship or ministries. Many members are worn out from the situation. In spite of all that is terrible about our current situation, I must say that Bethel is doing very very well. Think of it like this.

Winter comes and the ground freezes. You walk outside and see it in a frigid state, seemingly lifeless. Not much movement. Not much activity. The cold brings our visible world to an appearance of lifelessness. But, in fact, that is not true, for beneath the frost line the soil is teaming with life and activity. Roots continue to grow and draw nourishment. Critters and bugs push their way around in the

darkness. Microbes continue their life unaffected, consuming organic material, reproducing at fantastic rates, and constantly enriching the soil.



Looking from the outside at Bethel that has not had in-person worship or indoor programs for close to 9 months, you might conclude that things must be pretty dire, lifeless, and devoid of activity. But nothing could be further from the truth. Even in the pandemic, Bethel is teaming with life and vitality. We are setting down deeper and deeper roots. New roots are stretching out for new

opportunities. Staff and volunteers are pushing and straining to generate creative directions that are going to set Bethel up for an extended period of growth and vitality. One example for dramatic growth is the area of

> online and digital ministry. Churches that were started after 1994 are generally much better at reaching the community with online and digital efforts. That is because those churches were "born" with the internet and came of age during the rise of the internet. They are natives as churches to the digital world. Other churches, like Bethel, who have long

and wonderful historical roots did not come of age with the internet. Learning the internet was more a matter of convenience. For churches that started after 1994, mastering the internet was a necessity. If they didn't, they didn't get off the ground. One of the great opportunities the pandemic has provided Bethel is the

opportunity to get caught up with our use and understanding of the internet, and social media, as powerful tools for church growth. Now, everything we do is online. And we are learning fast. We are even working with a consultant to make sure that we get the most from this opportunity. We're learning what the best, the brightest, and the fastest growing churches in America are doing online that we could do to build a more dynamic Bethel. As a result, new roots are sinking deep. That is just one of half a dozen major benefits that we are realizing during this period of great stress and suffering but also great opportunity.

I know it is a hard time for everyone. It can even feel unbearable. But we are going to make it through, together. We're going to take it one day at a time, together. God is doing great things in ways that we can't always see in the moment. And we will do this, together, one step at a time. •

- 3. Choose a neighbor and follow the directions on the page to select one of the gift suggestions presented by the caring staff at MARC.
- 4. Purchase or order the gift EARLY and arrange delivery to Bethel by Monday, Dec 14.
- 5. Important instructions if ordering your gift online:
  - a. Specify that it is a gift and include GIFT WRAP
  - b. Have it labeled with the neighbor's name @ MARC-SOUTH

# Keep You Safe Bethel's Response to COVID



Wisconsin is in the midst of a dramatic increase in COVID cases, hospitalizations and deaths. The Madison Dane County Health Department responded on Nov 16 with a new public health order. This order says that there should be no indoor gatherings of people from different households, and outdoor gatherings are limited to 10 people or less. The COVID task force met to review the current situation in Dane County and recommend adjustments to Bethel's COVID plan.

The task force used data from public reporting of Dane County numbers to determine the risk of infection to Bethel members when we gather. If a group of six people gather in Dane County, the probability that one of those six is infectious is 25%. This helps us to understand why Dane County has advised that we not gather, even in small groups, at this time. In order to protect our members from infection, support our community's health, protect our health care workers, and preserve our local healthcare resources, the Joint Council has approved the following changes to the Bethel Safely Forward Plan:

- Cancel all meetings scheduled at Bethel. This
  includes: book groups, circles, blanket workshop,
  Bethel Bible Series and any other groups who were
  previously scheduled to meet in groups of 10 or
  less. Meetings will not be scheduled for future
  dates until Dane County lifts the ban on indoor
  gatherings.
- 2. Weddings, baptisms and funerals may continue with a maximum of 10 people. Only the religious service is allowed, with no receptions, meetings or meals before or after.

- 3. Homeless Ministry can continue outdoor distribution of mail, clothing, food and supplies according to their current policy under the "human services" exception to the order. They will continue to limit volunteers to only essential personnel and keep volunteers working in separate locations as much as possible.
- 4. Food Pantry can continue operations according to their current policy under the "human services" exception to the order. They will continue to limit the number of volunteers working in close proximity in the food pantry as much as possible.

Bethel will continue to offer Online Worship, Lord's Supper, Fireside Chats, Devotions, and Bible Study, in addition to Zoom Kids Ministry, Zoom Confirmation and Zoom Youth Group. We are grateful to the pastors, staff and volunteers who make this robust online faith community possible. The COVID Task Force will continue to meet as conditions change and will keep the congregation apprised of our recommendations.

### Realm Corner

## Where can I find the Council Meeting Minutes and Financial Reports?

Before COVID, if you wanted to read the minutes of the Council meeting you would have been able to find them hanging on a bulletin board in the hallway outside of Borgwardt Hall at Bethel. These documents were hung up on the bulletin board once they were approved at the next Council meeting. For example, the September minutes would have been hung up after being approved at the October council meeting.

Since members are not able to access the building like they were before COVID, where can you find the minutes and financial reports? I'm glad you asked.

Realm is our church database with all of our member information however, it is much more. If you are a member of Bethel you are in a group in Realm called "Bethel Member Directory". This group gives you access to the contact information of other members, like the old "Directory Book", but it is also where you can find the Church Council Minutes and Financial Report.

### How do you access them?

- 1. Sign into Realm using your account email and your password.
- 2. In the left-hand column, under the Bethel logo... Click on "Community".
- 3. Then click on "Groups".
- 4. Click on "Bethel Member Directory".
- 5. In the horizontal bar under Bethel Member Directory.... Click on "Files".
- 6. Scroll down and you will be able to see all of the 2019 and 2020 Council Meeting Minutes and Financial Reports.
- 7. Click on the report you would like to look at and it will open a new tab with the document in the bottom left corner of your computer.
- 8. Click on the tab and the document will open.

The documents are saved as PDF files, so you will need Acrobat Reader to read the documents.
