

Give charitably for tax savings

If you are age 70 ½ or older this year, it is the magic age for gifting from your IRA directly to a non-profit/charity – like Bethel! This eliminates the amount given as taxable income to you.

A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) must be paid directly to Bethel to avoid being taxable. It's proven to be a great way for many people of that age bracket to provide for their church, many times in a more significant way than they were able from their regular income or other appreciated assets. (In a given year, up to \$100,000 can be directed from one's IRA to a specific non-profit and avoid being taxable income for the donor.) QCDs also can count toward



one's Required Minimum Distribution – which is another great aspect of this gifting mechanism, depending on one's personal financial needs for daily living.
